1. THE PARTIES

1.1 DIY Legal Templates

1.2 The Partner

The “**Partner**” is the individual or entity identified in the Partner registration information submitted electronically through the Platform.

The Partner's registration information, including the Partner's name, professional details, contact information and other information supplied during onboarding, forms part of the records of this Agreement.

1.3 No paper agreement required

The Parties agree that no physical document or handwritten signature is required for acceptance of these Terms unless otherwise required by applicable law.

2. FORMATION OF THE AGREEMENT ONLINE

2.1 Electronic acceptance

The Partner accepts these Terms by:

- (a) completing the Partner registration process;
- (b) confirming acceptance of these Terms by ticking the designated acceptance box; and
- (c) clicking the “**JOIN US NOW**” button or equivalent electronic acceptance button.

2.2 Intention to be legally bound

The Partner acknowledges that the above actions constitute an express indication of the Partner's intention to enter into a legally binding agreement with DIY Legal Templates.

2.3 Effective date

The Agreement comes into effect on the date and time at which the Partner completes the electronic acceptance process.

2.4 Electronic records

DIY Legal Templates may electronically record and retain:

- the Partner's registration information;
- the version of these Terms accepted;

3. DEFINITIONS

For purposes of these Terms:

“Customer” means a person or entity who purchases, downloads or otherwise obtains an Accepted Template or engages a Partner through the Platform for Customisation Services.

“Customisation Services” means legal drafting, amendment, adaptation, review or other professional services provided by a Partner to a Customer through the Platform.

“Gross Sale Amount” means the amount actually charged to a Customer for a transaction before deductions permitted under these Terms.

“Net Revenue” means the amount available for revenue sharing after deductions expressly permitted under these Terms.

“Partner Account” means the electronic account created for the Partner on the Platform.

“Partner Content” means Templates and other material submitted by the Partner.

“Partner Share” means 75% of Net Revenue.

“Platform” means the DIY Legal Templates website, technology, marketplace and associated systems.

“Platform Share” means 25% of Net Revenue.

“Template” means a legal document, agreement, form, precedent, policy or other legal-document template submitted by a Partner.

4. THE DIY LEGAL TEMPLATES PARTNER PROGRAMME

4.1 The Partner Programme allows suitably qualified persons, including Malaysian lawyers and legal professionals where applicable, to submit legal-document templates for consideration for publication on the Platform.

4.2 The purpose of the Programme is to enable Partners to commercially exploit Templates they are legally entitled to provide while enabling DIY Legal Templates to offer Customers a broader range of legal-document resources.

4.3 Acceptance as a Partner does not guarantee that any Template will be accepted.

4.4 Participation does not guarantee any minimum number of sales, Customers or income.

4.5 The relationship is non-exclusive unless the Parties expressly agree otherwise in writing.

5. PARTNER ELIGIBILITY

5.1 The Partner must provide accurate information during registration.

5.2 Where the Partner represents that he or she is a lawyer, legal practitioner or other regulated professional, the Partner must possess and maintain the qualifications, registrations and authorisations required to undertake the services offered through the Platform.

5.3 DIY Legal Templates may require evidence of professional qualifications, practising status or other information before approving a Partner or Template.

5.4 DIY Legal Templates may refuse or suspend participation where information supplied by the Partner cannot reasonably be verified.

6. SUBMISSION OF TEMPLATES

6.1 Partners may submit Templates through the submission system provided by DIY Legal Templates.

6.2 Templates must comply with the applicable Template Submission Guidelines.

6.3 The Partner shall ensure that submitted Templates are:

- (a) properly formatted;
 - (b) reasonably complete;

8.3 The Partner shall not submit confidential documents belonging to a former or existing client unless the Partner has the legal right to do so.

8.4 The Partner shall not knowingly submit material copied from another lawyer, law firm, publisher, website or other source without the necessary rights.

9. LICENCE TO DIY LEGAL TEMPLATES

9.1 The Partner grants DIY Legal Templates a **non-exclusive licence** to use each Accepted Template for the purpose of operating and marketing the Platform.

9.2 The licence includes the right to:

10.6 The Partner's revenue entitlement shall be calculated according to the actual qualifying revenue generated from the transaction.

11. REVENUE SHARING

11.1 Standard split

Unless otherwise expressly agreed:

75% of Net Revenue → Partner

25% of Net Revenue → DIY Legal Templates

11.2 Application

The 75/25 arrangement applies to:

(a) Template sales; and

where the transaction is processed through the Platform.

11.3 No guaranteed income

12. PAYMENT TO PARTNERS

12.6 Once the relevant issue has been resolved, the applicable balance shall be released or adjusted accordingly.

13. SALES NOTIFICATION

13.1 Subject to technical availability, the Platform shall notify the Partner when one of the Partner's Templates is purchased.

13.2 Notifications may be sent by:

- email;
- WhatsApp; and/or
- Platform notification.

13.3 The Partner acknowledges that third-party communication services may occasionally fail or be delayed.

13.4 Failure to receive a notification does not invalidate a transaction.

14. REFUNDS AND CHARGEBACKS

14.1 If a Customer receives a refund, chargeback or payment reversal, DIY Legal Templates may reverse the corresponding Partner Share.

14.2 DIY Legal Templates may deduct the amount from future Partner earnings.

15.8 The Partner remains responsible for the professional quality and legal substance of Customisation Services personally undertaken by the Partner.

16. NO BYPASSING THE PLATFORM

16.1 The Platform is intended to provide the infrastructure through which Customers and Partners discover one another, communicate and transact.

16.2 A Partner shall not knowingly use the Platform to arrange for a Customer to complete a transaction outside the Platform for the purpose of avoiding the Platform's revenue share.

16.3 This includes:

(a) directing Customers to pay directly;

(b) providing bank details for direct payment;

(c) asking Customers to contact the Partner privately for the purpose of avoiding Platform fees;

(d) deliberately moving a Platform transaction to another website or service;

16.4 Nothing prevents a Partner from dealing independently with a person with whom the Partner had a genuine pre-existing relationship, provided that the transaction did not originate from the Platform and was not diverted from the Platform.

17. PLATFORM COMMUNICATIONS AND IDENTITY PROTECTION

17.1 DIY Legal Templates may provide an internal messaging facility through which Customers and Partners communicate.

17.2 To protect the integrity of the Platform, DIY Legal Templates may restrict the transmission of:

- telephone numbers;
- personal email addresses;
- WhatsApp numbers;
- external website addresses;
- social-media handles; and
- other direct-contact information.

17.3 The Partner agrees not to deliberately circumvent these safeguards.

19.3 The Partner shall not represent that DIY Legal Templates is providing legal advice on the Partner's behalf.

20. PARTNER WARRANTIES

The Partner warrants that:

20.1 the information supplied during registration is accurate;

20.2 the Partner has authority to enter into these Terms;

20.3 the Partner has the right to submit each Template;

20.4 the Template does not knowingly infringe third-party rights;

20.5 the Partner has obtained all necessary permissions;

20.6 the Partner will comply with applicable laws and professional requirements; and

20.7 the Partner will promptly notify DIY Legal Templates of any material change affecting the Partner's ability to participate in the Programme.

21. CUSTOMER RELATIONSHIP

23.1 The Parties shall comply with applicable Malaysian personal-data protection legislation.

23.2 DIY Legal Templates may collect and process Partner information for purposes including:

- registration;
- identity verification;
- account administration;
- payment;
- communications;
- fraud prevention;
- customer support;
- accounting;
- legal compliance; and
- operation of the Platform.

Malaysia's Personal Data Protection Act 2010 applies to processing personal data in connection with commercial transactions, and the Personal Data Protection Commissioner provides specific guidance concerning notice and choice and other data-protection obligations.  PDP +1

23.3 The Partner shall only use Customer personal data obtained through the Platform for authorised purposes.

23.4 The Partner shall take reasonable measures to prevent unauthorised access, disclosure or use of Customer information.

23.5 Any suspected personal-data breach involving Platform information shall be reported to DIY Legal Templates promptly.

24. PARTNER PROFILE AND MARKETING

24.1 The Partner authorises DIY Legal Templates to display information supplied by the Partner for purposes of identifying and marketing the Partner's Templates.

24.2 This may include:

- name;
- professional designation;
- law firm name;
- areas of practice;
- approved biography; and
- Template information.

24.3 DIY Legal Templates may create reasonable descriptions, excerpts and promotional material concerning Accepted Templates.

24.4 DIY Legal Templates shall not knowingly make false statements regarding the Partner's qualifications or experience.

25. TEMPLATE WITHDRAWAL

25.1 A Partner may request removal of an Accepted Template by giving notice through the Platform or by email.

25.2 DIY Legal Templates shall use reasonable efforts to remove the Template from new sales within [5] working days.

25.3 Existing Customers who have already purchased the Template shall not automatically lose their contractual rights merely because the Template is subsequently withdrawn.

25.4 DIY Legal Templates may retain archival copies where reasonably necessary for legal, accounting or regulatory purposes.

26. SUSPENSION AND REMOVAL BY DIY LEGAL TEMPLATES

DIY Legal Templates may suspend or remove a Template or Partner Account where reasonably necessary because:

(a) the Partner has breached these Terms;

27.1 DIY Legal Templates may modify, upgrade, suspend or discontinue parts of the Platform.

27.2 The Partner acknowledges that technology, payment systems, communication systems and Platform features may change over time.

27.3 DIY Legal Templates shall use reasonable efforts to avoid changes that materially prejudice accrued Partner earnings.

28. CHANGES TO THESE TERMS

28.1 Operational changes

DIY Legal Templates may update operational, technical and administrative requirements where reasonably necessary to operate the Programme.

28.2 Material changes

Where DIY Legal Templates proposes a material change to these Terms, reasonable notice shall be provided to affected Partners.

28.3 Continued participation

28.4 Version control

Each electronically accepted version shall be identified by a version number and effective date.

41. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

Failure to enforce a provision immediately shall not constitute a waiver of the right to enforce that provision subsequently.

44. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

44.1 These Terms shall be governed by the laws of **Malaysia**.

44.2 The Parties submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of Malaysia.

45. ELECTRONIC ACCEPTANCE

That creates a considerably better evidential trail than simply having a sentence saying *“By registering, you agree to our terms.”*

One important change from the previous agreement

I have **not** made the 12-month post-termination non-circumvention provision as broad as the earlier draft. That's deliberate. The Partner is an independent professional, and a blanket restriction preventing them from dealing with people they already know could create unnecessary legal and commercial complications.

The protection you really need is simpler:

If DIY Legal Templates introduces the Customer to the lawyer and the lawyer deliberately takes that transaction off-platform to avoid the 25% fee, that is a breach.

That's the behaviour your system needs to prevent, and the contract should target that behaviour rather than trying to prevent the lawyer from doing business generally.

And one more thing I'd do before launch

I would **not treat this Partner Agreement as the only legal document on the site**. You should have four separate pieces working together:

1. **Partner Terms & Conditions** — the document above.
2. **Partner Submission Guidelines** — practical rules about what lawyers can upload and how templates must be formatted.
3. **Customer Terms & Conditions** — governing people who buy/download documents.
4. **Privacy Notice** — covering both customers and Partners.

That separation will make the platform much easier to operate and update. It is also particularly important for the privacy side because Malaysia's PDPA applies to personal-

data processing in commercial transactions, and the Commissioner specifically requires appropriate notice concerning collection, use, disclosure and further processing.  P... +1

One final point for your Malaysian lawyer: I would specifically ask them to review the **electronic acceptance mechanism, the lawyer/customisation model, the 75/25 revenue arrangement, the anti-circumvention provisions, the copyright licence, and the treatment of Customer–lawyer relationships**. Those are the provisions where the commercial concept of DIY Legal Templates intersects most directly with Malaysian legal and professional requirements.
